Any guardian violating this code can and will be removed from any future PPYS events including, but not limited to, games, competitions, fundraising events and award ceremonies.

- I hereby pledge to provide positive support, care and encouragement for my child participating in the athletic program by following this Code of Conduct.
- I promise to set a good example for my child by extending the same respect to all players, coaches, fans, and officials.
- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches and officials at every game, practice or other League event.
- I will place the emotional and physical well being of my child ahead of any personal desire to win.
- I will provide support for coaches and officials working with my child to provide a positive, enjoyable experience for all.
- I understand and will abide by the 24 hour rule as posted by PPYS.
- I will treat other players, coaches, fans and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed, or ability.
- I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, fans and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed, or ability.
- I will help my child enjoy the experience within my personal constraints by assisting with coaching, fundraising, being a respectful fan, providing transportation or whatever I am capable of doing.
- I will demand a drug-free and alcohol-free sporting environment for my child and agree to assist by refraining from their use at all League events.
- I will require that my child's coach demonstrate the responsibilities in being a coach and that he or she agree to the Coaches' Code of Ethics as set forth by the League.
- I will always remember, this is a developmental league where my child participates in a GAME that is designed for all CHILDREN involved and NEVER for the ADULTS.
- I will abide by and uphold the PPYS anti-bullying policy and educate my child on the importance of our bully free zone.
